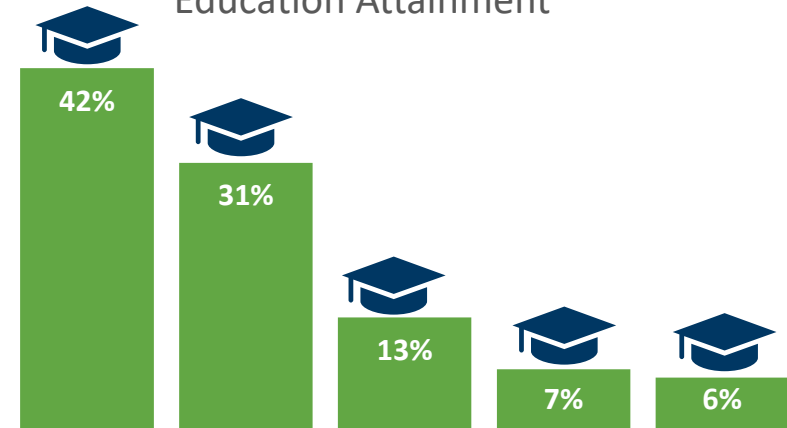

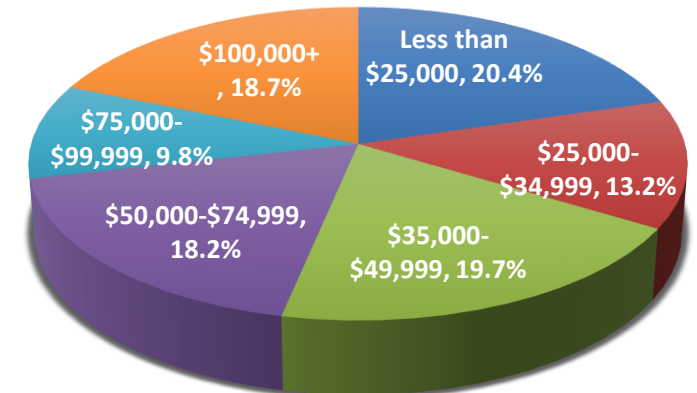

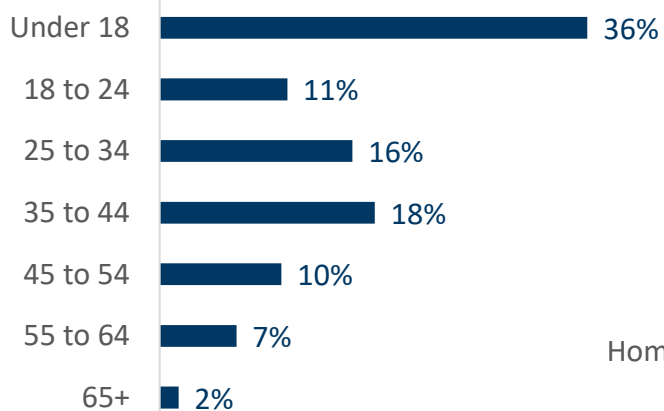

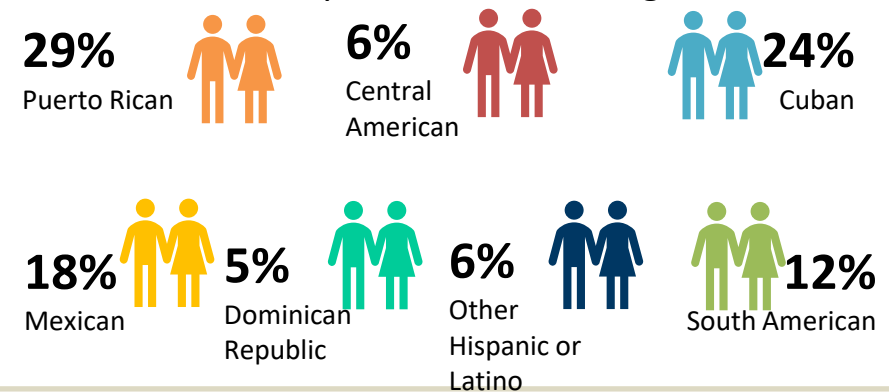

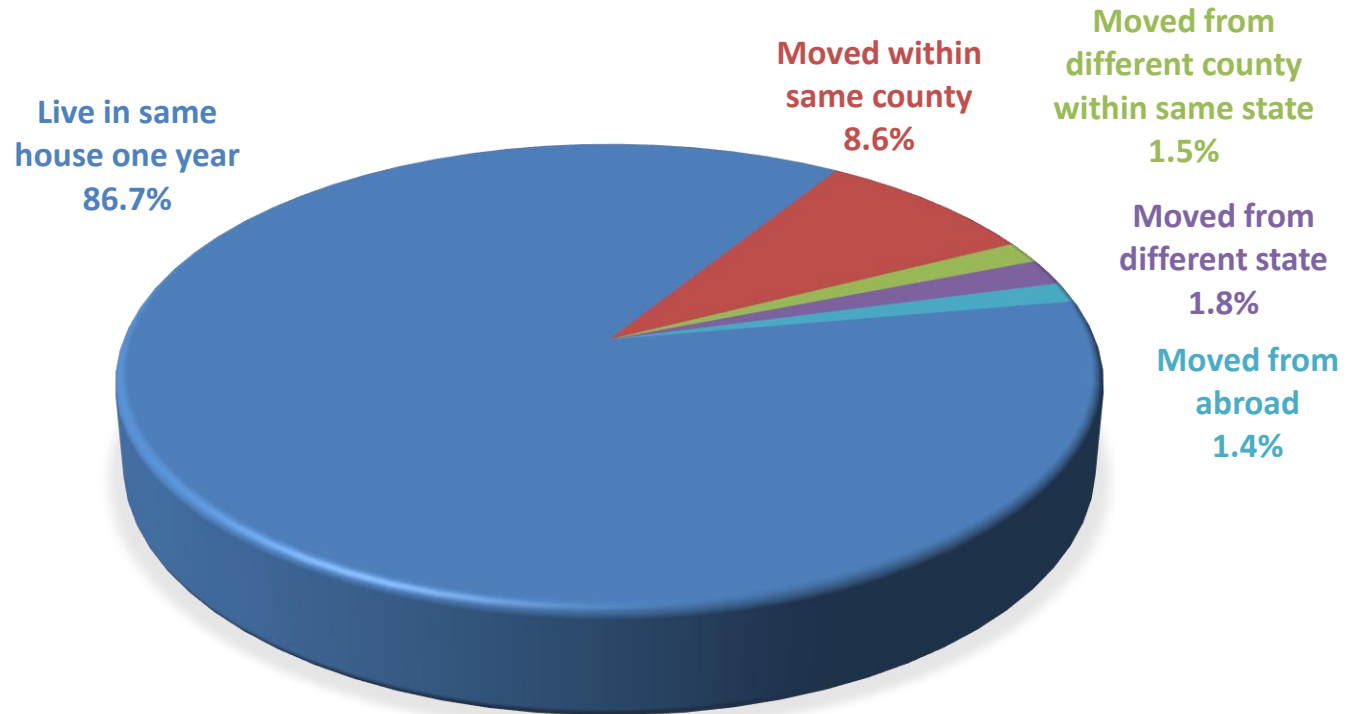

Mexican Mobility Past Year in Hillsborough County

- According to the census geographical mobility from the 2017-2021 5-Year American Community Survey, 87% of the Mexican residents living Hillsborough County live in the same house they did a year ago.
- About nine percent moved within the same county.
- Two percent either moved from a different county in Florida or moved from an entirely different state.
- The remaining Mexican residents moved to Hillsborough County from abroad.



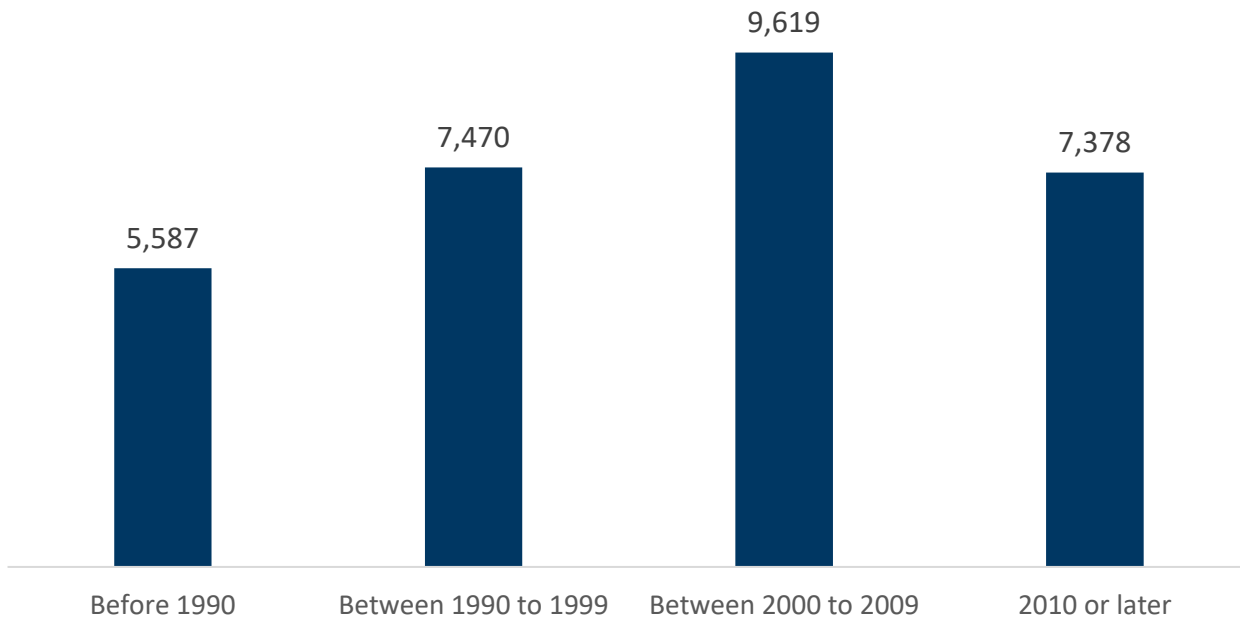

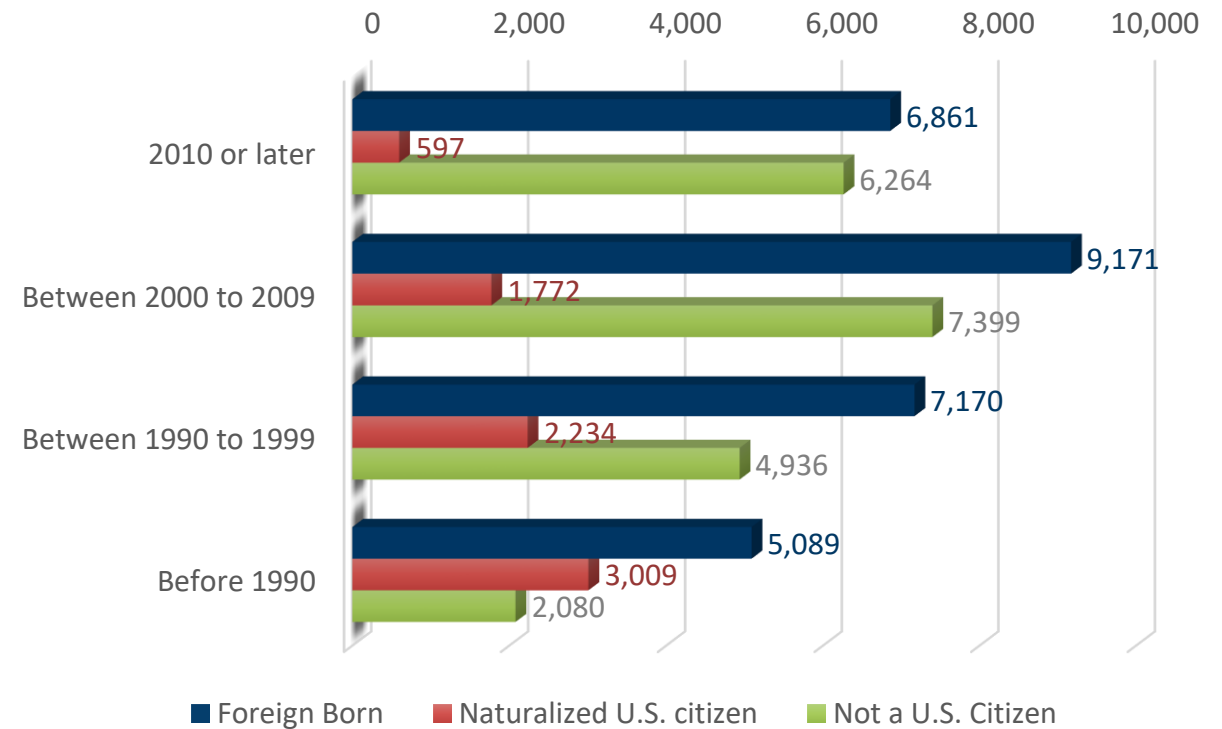
Year Mexican Residents Arrived in Hillsborough County

- Since 1990 over 30,000 Mexicans have made Hillsborough County home with the largest number of 9,619 coming between 2000 and 2009.
- The majority or 73% of the foreign-born Mexicans who moved to Hillsborough County since 1990 are not U.S. Citizens, while the remaining 27% are naturalized U.S. citizens.

Foreign Born Mexicans Who are Naturalized U.S. Citizens or Not



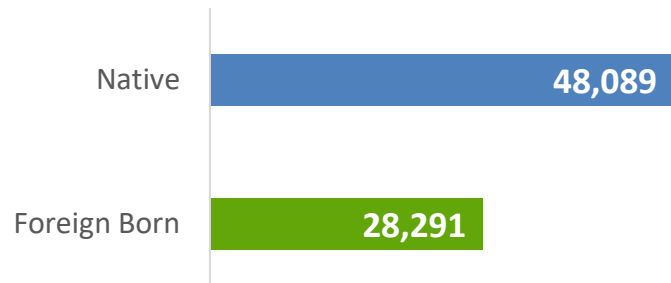

Mexican Residents Place of Birth By Nativity and Citizenship

- Of the 48,000 Native Mexicans living in Hillsborough County, 67% were born in the state of Florida of residents and 29% were born in other regions within the U.S. The remaining 4% were born outside the U.S.
- Nearly half or 45% were born in the South, followed by 25% born in the West and the other third were born in the Midwest and Northeast.
- Most foreign-born Mexicans come from Latin America with over 20,600 of them not U.S. Citizens.



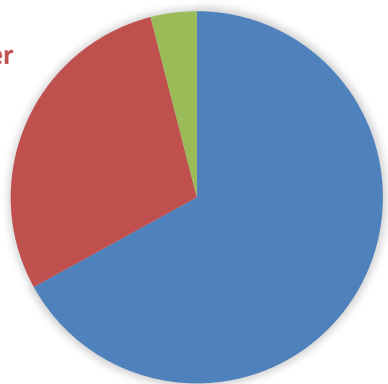
WHERE NATIVE MEXICANS WERE BORN

Born outside the U.S.

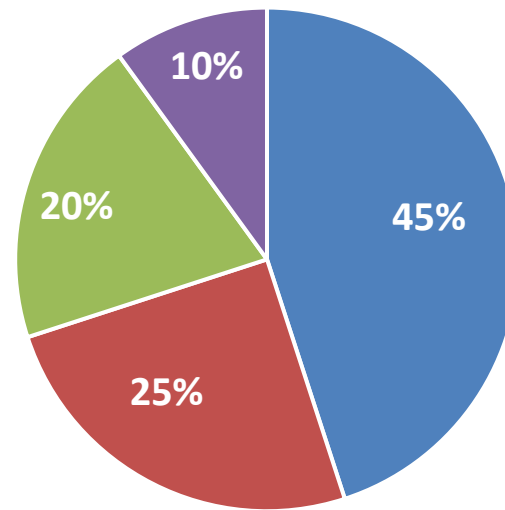

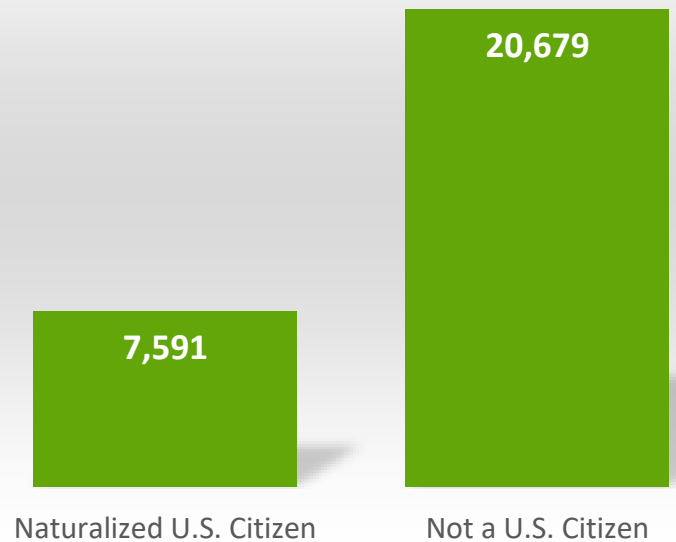


Native Born By Region in the United States
